

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The monthly meeting of EAA Chapter 27 was called to order at 10:04 March 17, 1996 by President Jim Simmons.

Attendees were welcomed, especially those who were "a wearing of the green." Visitors were asked to say a few words about themselves and how they heard about Chapter 27. Two new members were also added to the roster.

The first order of business was the treasurer's report. Bob reported that our current balance is \$1130.45. The report was motioned for acceptance by Stan and seconded by Ed Morris

Fran Uliano reported on the present status of pilots willing to fly on Young Eagles Day which is June 8th. Presently Chapter 27 has flown 82 youngsters. Our chapter goal for 1996 is 80. The tape we made of the Young Eagles for demonstration purposes is being edited. Jim reminded pilots that Phillips 66 has renewed support of this program and will give a one dollar per gallon rebate if you use their credit card. The pancake breakfast scheduled for June 8th was cancelled as no one was willing to flip the flapjacks

Joe Page reported on the current situation of the fly-in. All systems are go.

The airport improvement project seems to have been narrowed down for the present to the creation of a tetrahedron. Bob Ryan volunteered to head up this project with a minimum of arm twisting.

Our connection with Trade-A-Plane is in action and two issues will be given away as part of the 50/50 program.

For those interested, our EAA chapter celebrated its 40th year of continual operation in February. It was founded by Jim Markey in February, 1956. Jim's EAA number is 557. The next closest number belongs to Stan Solecki, whose number is 19,800. Stan was also a member of the original group.


The open forum program was provided by Gordon Schimmel, who gave a display of flight materials he uses for instruction. Gordon teaches both in a classroom setting and a summer camp program.

The 50/50 was a success for three people this month. One person won money and two people won copies of Trade-A-Plane.

The seminar was presented by Ed Morris, who spoke to the group about annual inspections of experimental aircraft. He had a number of handouts, one of which was an outline of all areas to be checked during an annual. This outline ran to four pages on both sides of the paper and was the most complete form I have seen.

The April chapter meeting will be held at Bob Burk's shop. There we will see a complete RV-6A built before our eyes and in only two hours.
