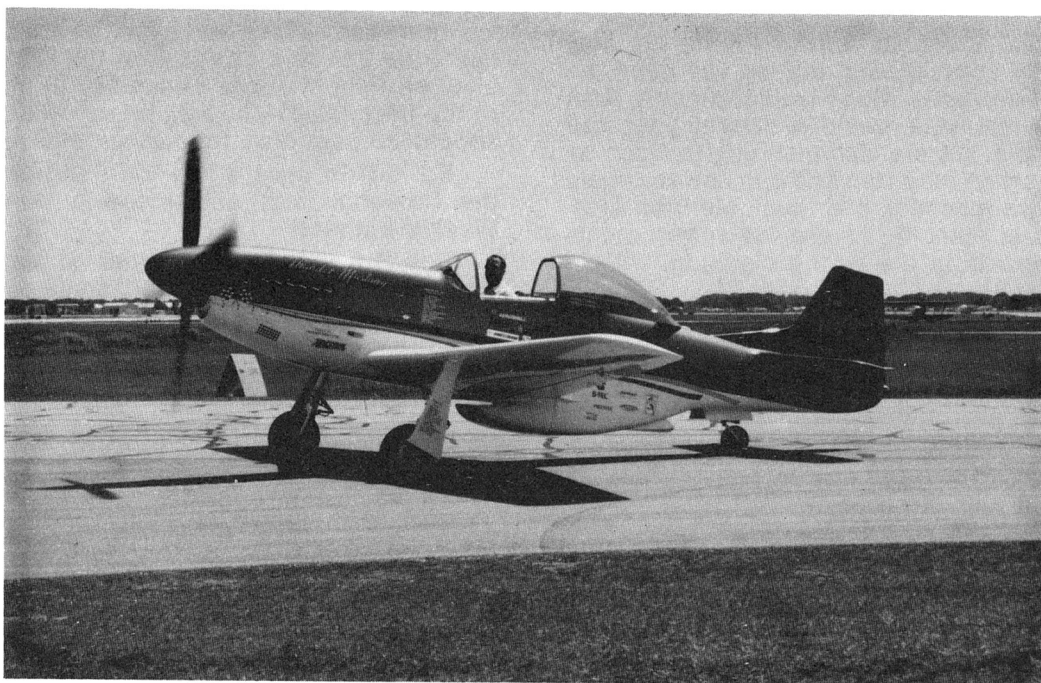

I decided at the last minute to go to Sun 'n Fun. A couple of people I had asked to go declined for various reasons and since the weather was going down I found myself taking off alone Saturday morning at 6:30 a.m.

My first stop was Accomack, then on to Lumberton, where I found Dan Culhane, Jerry Carlson and Lowell Manery. Lumberton is a friendly field where they offer a discount on gas to EAA members. Also, free soda. I also stopped at Walterboro to visit an old Gent who flew in WW II.

After that it was on to Deland where I thought I'd spend the night but that didn't work out so it was on to Lake Wales where I had a room rented. I landed at Lake Wales in the dark. Going into a strange field after dark is kind of eerie.

To make matters worse the car rental company had closed down till Monday. Maybe it was just as well because I slept most of Sunday.

Monday I got the car and zipped over to Lakeland. The displays of Kit airplanes were great—A lot of nice planes—all very expensive!

The new Cessna Skyhawk and Skylane were there. To me, they were a big disappointment. They certainly are not modern airplanes. (By the way, if you want to see a new Skyhawk, there is one at Robinson).

The Airshow with Sean Tucker and Bob Hoover was great. There were also 3 Swifts performing together and 5 Acro type planes flying close formation aerobatics.

After the air show I stood at the fence and watched departures. I think I have a picture of Chuck and Debbie departing.

I looked up Carl Eaton and was promptly recruited into Security. He stuck an orange vest on me and off we went. Two hours later I left for the day.

Tuesday, the Shell dash was interesting. Listening to the big Chevy's in the P-51 replica and the Legend was music to this old Chevy mechanic's ears. The Thunder Mustang V12 was actually rather quiet.

That afternoon I was recruited by Carl again and spent some time pulling Glasairs out of the sand. 500x5 wheels don't do well in sand.

I had gotten a weather briefing Tuesday afternoon and found I had better leave Wednesday. So by 8:30 a.m. Wednesday morning I had checked out of the motel, dropped off the car and was airborne.

I stopped at Walterboro, Wilson Industrial, and was really humming along (155 ground speed) till I got to Accomack. The wind there was 18 gusting to 25, 90 degrees to the runway. I ran out of rudder and aborted the landing. I flew on to Ocean City where the runway pointed directly into the wind. After leaving there I had to fly more and more into the headwind, eventually hitting a low of 78 m.p.h. Also, at one spot I went to full power to climb and showed 500 fpm down!

After being pounded coming up the Hudson River corridor I turned for home and landed about 7:15 p.m. Total time was 21 hours, 10.8 down and 10.2 back. It actually was an enjoyable trip. I pushed the Old Airplane hard and it gave me no trouble at all.
