Have you ever preflighted your plane, hopped in buckled up, and maybe even started your engine and realized you do not have your sun glasses, reading glasses or both? It happened too many times for me. I bought a couple eyeglass cases and attached them just above the windshield. All I have to do is reach up and get them. The glasses always stay with the plane so I never have to worry about being without them. Mine are attached to the tube structure with a clip. Other people will find Velcro attachment to the ceiling interior works well. You can also simply put them in a seat pocket or glove box. Flying without sunglasses is unsafe and flying without corrective lenses is illegal. (Mark)


