Tech Counselor Tip

When working on your panel removing small screws and parts be sure to put down a towel or small blanket on the floor. The last thing you want is a screw falling through a small hole often found around pedals, flap handles, and other floor penetrations. It is dangerous to have loose hardware bouncing around under the floor. It can be lodged in the control system and bind up controls.
