




Meeting Minutes

February 19, 2023

Treasurer's Report. \$34,013.65. The balance is so high because the Spirit of Meriden made their final payment for the RV-12. We had a discussion on ways to use that money. We could build another plane. Mark is not able to coordinate that. It would need a commitment for 3 years. Another option is to set up a scholarship fund. Any other ideas are welcome. Lucy has received the balance of her Ray Scholarship.

Dave Matuska is painting his plane in stages. It's looking really good. He's painted the wings and is working on smaller parts. Fuselage covering is coming next. Dave Rich showed off the bending jig he made for building autopilot parts. Doug Dringoli is working on his A&P rating. The open house at Doug Hoon's was very successful.



Ray Aviation Scholarship awarded:

We have been selected by EAA to participate in the Ray Aviation Scholarship for 2023. There are 182 scholarships for 2023 with 167 chapters of which 23 are new this year. We will now begin the process of selecting our scholar for 2023. Here are the requirements.

- 1. 16 to 19 years old
- 2. Student pilot certificate
- 3. Medical certificate
- 4. Able to begin training within 60 days.
- 5. Commit to 2 hours/month of chapter volunteering.
- 6. Complete training within 12 months.

New this year they have increased the scholarship amount to \$11,000.

342 scholars have received their pilots license through the Rays Aviation Scholarship. 180 scholars are currently in training. The completion percentage is over 80% compared to the national average of 20%. By any means the Ray Aviation Scholarship has been an incredibly successful program.

So, keep your eyes and ears open for potential Ray Scholars. An application can be picked up at the airport or you can direct someone to my email address at tspitler@gmail.com and I will send them an application. All applications should be returned to tspitler@gmail.com by April 30th A committee will then review the application and select our Ray Scholar who we will submit to EAA for approval.



Tech Tip of the Month

When you build an airplane you drill thousands of holes. It is important to position them accurately. Many times, a drill bit will wonder off your marked location as you start to drill. To my surprise a lot of people don't know about spring loaded canter punches. This is a great device that puts a well-positioned dimple in metal, wood, or fiberglass such that the bit does not wonder. You simply press vertically down and as the tip retracts into the barrel it compresses a spring. When it reaches a pre-determined compression force it releases forcing the tip into the material. Around our house we call it the kerchunker because of the sound it makes. If you don't have one go get one!
